2017 Details

CAMP ATMOSPHERE: Adventure Camp is a fun-filled, fast-paced early childhood environment. All campers must be potty trained and able to take themselves to the toilet. No pull-ups or diapers and children must be able to communicate with the staff when they need assistance going to the bathroom.

Campers must also have experience being dropped off in a group childcare setting. If a child is unable to adapt to the camp setting, for the safety and harmony of all campers, the child may be sent home. **This camp has a 1:5 staff to child ratio.**



FOOD: Creating and eating theme related, fun and delicious snacks is an important part of the Adventure Camp experience. Portion sizes are limited on any sweet treats we serve, and we are willing to work with your child's dietary restrictions by supplementing or modifying our snack within reason. It is essential that you inform staff in writing of any and all food restrictions related to your child.

Be sure your child brings a nut-free lunch. Pack food that is easy and enjoyable for them to eat. Don't be concerned if they don't eat their entire lunch. Most children this age will not eat a big lunch, especially since eating with friends is distracting. Snacks are provided and they can finish their lunch when they get home.

WHAT TO WEAR: Make sure your child wears clothes that can get dirty, as many of our projects may be messy! Cover up attempts are made, but there is no guarantee that the materials used will not leave a stain. Please dress accordingly. Kids are inside and outside throughout the camp, so please send

your child wearing sunscreen and a hat. Weather permitting; there will be short walks on several days. Have your child wear comfortable closed toe active shoes. It can be hot or cold, so plan accordingly.

WHAT TO LEAVE AT HOME: Please be sure your child does not bring toys from home. There are lots of fun and exciting activities planned and treasures from home may get lost or broken.

MISS JOAN & STAFF: Adventure Camp staff have diverse areas of expertise and are caring, fun, responsible and energetic! Miss Joan is a Tahoe local of over 27 years and the mother of two amazing teenagers. Miss Joan utilizes her extensive knowledge of toys, stories and crafts to create a camp experience that blends learning and imagination.

CANCELLATION POLICY

In order to ensure the highest quality camps, the following cancellation policy has been implemented: All E.P.I.C. Camps include a \$35 nonrefundable materials fee. Before June 1st: 100% refund & material fee can be waived if you are accommodated in another program. June 2nd until the Monday, 1 week before camp start date: 70% refund, minus materials fee. No refunds if cancellation is made less than 1 week before camp start date. No refunds for missed days of camp. IVGID reserves the right to cancel or change any program. If IVGID cancels a program, a full refund will be issued.

PARKING: At Diamond Peak, park in the upper or lower lot. If you're driving into the lower parking lot, enter slowly through the upper gate even though the signs say "Exit Only."

SIGN IN/ SIGN OUT: You must sign your child in/out each day & provide staff with a number where you can be reached. Please let staff know if someone other than a parent will be picking up your child.
