

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# from our Community Services Director...

Summer is here and the NGTD Community Services facilities are in full swing.

As I meet people out in the community I am often asked, "What exactly is community services?" Great question! It is a new consolidation of all of the recreation and quality of life offerings into one department.

The department of Community Services includes Beaches, Parks, Facilities/Food and Beverage, Tennis, Recreation, Diamond Peak Ski Resort, The Golf Courses at Incline Village, and Marketing. These divisions were consolidated into one department to provide better working efficiencies, coordination, and communication since each venue serves many of our same residents.



Our residents and their guests will have much to choose from this summer. The Golf Courses at Incline Village, which include the par-72 Championship Course and the par-58 Mountain Course, have exceptional course conditions this year, and we have implemented some new programs. A new pricing structure will provide several price options depending on the time of the day. This dynamic pricing allows golfers to choose the price best for their budget, and helps balance out the demand for golf throughout the day, providing better utilization of the courses. There will also be some new fun options for play. An after-work Golf League will kick off in August and the Championship Course will host two evening Glow Golf Extravaganzas with neon glow putting challenges, glow in the dark chipping contests and shoot outs on the driving range, as well as glowing cocktails and live music will be during the event.

The community's Parks & Recreation Department will see their highest number of programs and events on record. Within this issue you will find activities for all age groups and interests. The popular Starlight Cinema - our family-friendly movie night at Aspen Grove – will begin in July. Of note for our kids are the Science Specialty Camps, both Junior and Adult tennis camps and clinics, teens will learn leadership and life skills in our Leaders in Training and Education (LITE) program and of course you can learn to swim in the gorgeous setting of Burnt Cedar Pool. For the grown-ups, summer is a great time to focus on fun and fitness, and this year some new offerings will take advantage of the great setting of Diamond Peak Ski Resort - new Yoga and Tai Chi classes will be hosted on the Base Lodge deck, Community Hikes will go to Snowflake Lodge.

With the great snow pack we had this year, the lake level is rising and it should be a terrific season at our beaches. We expect the higher lake level will make boat launching easier. Based on feedback from the community, the Burnt Cedar pool facility will have a longer season this year. We opened May 14 which was our earliest opening on record, and we plan to be open until October 2. With the success of our Paddleboard programs last season we have expanded our offerings including Paddleboard Camps for kids and Paddleboard Yoga for adults. Plan to spend your days enjoying our incredible beaches and be sure to take advantage of an outdoor massage while you are there.

Finally, we hope to see you as we partner with Red, White, and Tahoe Blue for the Community's Annual 4th of July festivities that will run July 1 through July 4. Enclosed is this issue are the full details of new shuttle schedules, parking, beach entry fees, and event details.





This is a multi use area to be enjoyed by all ages. Parking is available at the Recreation Center, 980 Incline Way. Parking is not permitted at the Tennis Center. The 1st hole is located on the west side of the Recreation Center entrance road.

ay back in 1966, while the community of Incline Village was still in its defining stages, Oklahoma native Art Wood envisioned a four-season resort community – a "Pebble Beach of the Sierra" as many have said – and hired Austrian ski consultant Luggi Foeger to design and build Ski Incline (as it was then called) as one of the pillars of that vision.

After only four months of construction, Ski Incline opened its lifts in November of 1966 with a skier-friendly layout on the lower mountain of the resort. In 1987, ski resort manager Jurgen Wetzstein led the development of the upper mountain with the addition of the Crystal Quad to the top of the peak – an expansion that doubled the resort's skiable acreage and added more

advanced terrain. The addition also spurred the name change to Diamond Peak.

During the upcoming 2016-17 winter season, Diamond Peak will celebrate its golden anniversary – 50 years of skiing and snowboarding in the most beautiful setting on earth – and we are inviting the entire community of Incline Village/Crystal Bay as well as our extended Diamond Peak family around the world to help us commemorate this milestone.

n February 24, 2016, the Incline Village General Improvement District's Board of Trustees approved, via unanimous vote, the IVGID Beaches Recreation Enhancement Opportunities Plan. The approval of this document, which can be viewed at www.ivgidbeachstudy.com, was the culmination of two years of work to develop comprehensive recommendations to guide future capital investment made by the District at Burnt Cedar, Incline, Ski, and Hermit Beaches. The development of the Enhancement Plan included two publically held meetings (one to discuss site analysis findings and one to discuss survey results and site improvement opportunities), dozens of hours of operations and site use observations, numerous interviews with operations staff and concessionaires, and extensive surveying that included an intercept survey of beach users (with 267 responses) and a mailed and on-line community survey (with 2,149 responses).

Based on this comprehensive effort, the Enhancement Plan identifies numerous potential improvements to the facilities at the Beaches and their estimated costs. These include:

 Improvement of entries and pedestrian access at all Beach properties to expedite the check-in process and enhance pedestrian safety.

- Replacement of the restroom/concession building at Incline Beach to create a beachfront hospitality zone.
- Replacement of the restroom building at Burnt Cedar Beach to improve use, increase the number of available fixtures, and replace aging infrastructure.
- Enhancement of the Burnt Cedar Pool House for improved concession operations.
- Enhancement of the Burnt Cedar Pool mechanical equipment for improved and more reliable operations.
- Enhancement of the group and individual picnic/ BBQ areas at all Beach properties with additional focus on the individual sites on the western side of Burnt Cedar Beach to improve customer experience and enhance use.
- Enhancement of beachfront access and pedestrian connectivity at all Beach properties with additional focus on connectivity between the western site amenities and the eastern beachfront areas at Burnt Cedar Beach to improve customer experience and enhance use.
- Provision of non-motorized watercraft storage and a formal launching area on the western side of Burnt

Cedar Beach, similar to operations at Hermit Beach, to reduce the waiting list presently in place for storage at Hermit Beach.


 Development of a consistent design aesthetic for all architectural and site finishes across all Beach properties including buildings, shelters, signage (including fonts and colors), landscape/retaining walls, curbs, and walkways.

The recommendations in the Enhancement Plan are simply recommendations and the purpose of the document is to guide the major capital improvements that could be completed at the Beach Properties over the next 10 to 15 years. Ultimately, the projects selected for implementation and the pace at which those projects are completed must be decided by the District's Board of Trustees based on input from the residents of Incline Village.

Of the improvements identified in the Enhancement Plan, the project overwhelmingly identified by the community surveys as the top priority is the replacement of the restroom/concession building at Incline Beach. Funds to complete design of this work were included in the District's FY 2015/2016 budget as well as the proposed FY 2016/2017 budget. A comprehensive Request for Qualifications process to select a design team was completed this spring. The

goal of the project is to replace the over capacity and aging 1970s structure with a robust and modern facility that meets the capacity needs of today's operations at Incline Beach and the expectations of Incline Village residents. A new facility will enhance food and beverage operations and customer service by incorporating current industry best practices for food and beverage concessions and commercial kitchen design. Additionally, a new facility will enhance the quality, size, and number of restrooms available at Incline Beach and will also provide restrooms capable of use during the winter to allow the elimination of the temporary portable toilets during the cold weather months. Finally, a new facility will enhance the customer experience at Incline Beach by including a shaded outdoor seating area, outdoor showers, and improved customer flow from the drop-off area and parking lots to the beachfront.

Once a design contract is approved by the District's Board of Trustees, design work will begin aggressively over the summer, fall, and winter of 2016. Construction schedule of the new facility will be dictated by the scope of work developed during design and future budget approvals by the Board of Trustees but would begin no sooner than the fall of 2017. The design process will include extensive community outreach and information sessions as well as opportunities for public comment and feedback. Stay tuned this summer for more information on this exciting District project!



## Community Services Master Plan

This summer we will be kicking off a year-long process of master planning for the future of IVGID Community Services, and we need to hear what the community wants for its' facilities and programs. Community Services encompasses the Beaches, Parks, Recreation Programs, the Recreation Center, The Golf Courses at Incline, and Diamond Peak Ski Resort. The last effort was in 2000 when the Incline Village Recreational Facilities Master Plan was completed. Updating these plans every ten to fifteen years is good practice as it provides road map for maintaining or revitalizing the existing community amenities and/or expanding the venues to provide the new features the community desires.

Together, we will develop a long-range community services master plan to identify and plan for the future of community driven recreation activities and facilities in Incline Village and Crystal Bay. To date, the District has undertaken significant effort to assess many of the existing recreation facilities and operations and has developed planning documents, by venue, that identify the capital maintenance needs as well as the operational enhancement and future infrastructure investment opportunities. Now is the time to assess the community priorities for future infrastructure investment in the existing venues or evaluate what services/facilities not presently provided by the District that are desired by the community.

Throughout this project we will conduct public meetings and community surveys to assess expectations, help set priorities, evaluate the opportunities for additional/expanded recreational offerings and facilities, and if identified - assess the community's willingness to fund new or different facilities and programs. Look for Community Workshops this summer and plan to join your neighbors in a dialogue about what IVGID Community Services should be to serve our residents in the next 20 years.


# **2016-2017 ANNUAL BUDGET**

## Facility Fees

Your Recreation Facility Fee is used to provide an availability of service for recreational amenities to the parcel owners and residents of the Incline Village/Crystal Bay Community. Your Beach Facility Fee provides an availability of service for Burnt Cedar, Incline, Hermit and Ski Beaches and is assessed only to parcels within the District as of June 1, 1968, per deed restrictions listed on the beach property. Both fees are annually billed on the Washoe County property tax bills and are listed as separate items. Billing the Recreation Facility Fee and Beach Facility Fee, on the Washoe County property tax bill, is a cost effective method.


## Charts for the 2016-2017 Annual Budget


The District has budgeted Total Uses of \$45.1 Million, they will provide theses service areas.

2016-2017 - Total Budgeted Sources by IVGID Fund/Function



The IVGID Public Works Department is responsible for the drinking water system and the sewer system for Incline Village and Crystal Bay. In order to treat and supply an average of 1 billion gallons of water annually our water system infrastructure assets include:

- A UV & Ozone Water Treatment Plant able to treat up to 8.5 million gallons daily
- 100 Miles of Water Mains between 4" to 24"
- 2,031 Gate Valves
- 13 Water Tanks with 7 Million Gallons of Storage
- 14 Water Pumping Stations with 26 Pressure Zones
- Service connections to over 4,300 Water Meters

And in order to treat an average of 474 million gallons of sewage annually our sewer infrastructure assets include:


- 105 Miles of Gravity Lines and 14 Miles of Sewer Force Main between 6" to 24"
- 1,926 Sewer Manholes
- 19 Sewer Pump Stations
- A wastewater treatment plant able to treat up to 2.1 million gallons daily
- 20 Miles of Effluent Pipeline to Carson Valley
- A 900 acre wetland site located in the Carson Valley for effluent water

It has been estimated that the replacement value of the water and sewer system is over \$600 million. This is why a utility rate study is conducted every year to make sure that your water and sewer system is fully funded for years to come. Public Works uses federally recognized benchmarks and management strategies to maximize our resources, improve performance, and safeguard the community's assets for the future. The primary purpose of our annual rate study is to make sure we utilize the management strategy of financial viability.

Without fully funding a Utility, the value of the community asset will suffer and jeopardize disinfection and the delivery of safe potable water and the collection and treatment of wastewater. Conversely, performing long term financial planning ensures that future generations, like our customers today, will be able to rely on safe potable drinking water and properly collected and treated wastewater. The water and sewer rates are made up of three main components: fixed charges, variable charges, and capital improvement charges. Each major division in the water and sewer budget has a portion of fixed and variable costs and the rates are designed to fund these expenses.

## **Fixed Charges (Water and Sewer Base** and Water and Sewer Admin Rates)

To provide water and sewer services, there is a portion of the costs that are fixed charges or "ready-to-serve costs." Essentially, there is a certain level of costs that are incurred to staff, operate and maintain our system prior to delivering any water or treating any wastewater from our customers. There is a regulatory requirement for minimum staffing to be prepared to provide service, a certain amount of supplies such as tools, training, and equipment that are needed to be ready to serve and there are electrical and gas charges to our facilities so that they can be ready to serve.



### Variable Charges (Water and Sewer Use Rates)

To provide water and sewer services, there is a portion of the costs that are variable charges. These charges are the costs to treat and distribute water and to collect, treat and dispose wastewater. The variable charge for water is essentially the cost to pump it out of Lake Tahoe, treat the water and deliver it to the customer. The variable charge for sewer is essentially what it costs to collect the wastewater from each property and deliver it to the wastewater plant, treat the wastewater, pump and dispose of the effluent and biosolids to the Carson Valley per State and TRPA requirements. This requires staff, chemicals, supplies, tools, equipment, and energy to perform these services. You could also call this the commodity cost or product cost.

## **Water and Sewer Capital Improvement Rates**

The capital improvement charge funds the replacement of water and sewer infrastructure. There are separate connection fees to new customers to buy into existing infrastructure. The capital charge is based on funding the costs of the five-year capital improvement plan with a consideration for the multi-year capital plan out a total of twenty years.



The following table provides the historical monthly water and sewer utility bill for our average residential user (71,578 gallons water use per year) in the District's service area from 2011 to the 2016.

The average residential rate has increased \$21.16 per month from \$76.23 in 2011 to \$97.39 in 2016. There has been an increase of \$11.78 per month to pay for the effluent export project which is 55% of the total rate increase of \$ 21.16 per month over the last five years.

Over the last five years, the residential family median user has seen an average rate increase of 5% per year. The capital rate has increased by 3.9% and the operating rate has increased by (a total of \$5.12) 1.3% per year for 5 years. The figure below shows the area water and sewer rates using the average residential IVGID customer for the water use pattern and then applying the appropriate agency rates to get a total water and sewer bill.



## **Effluent Export Pipeline**

In 1970, the District constructed a 21-mile pipeline as part of the bi-state effort to protect Lake Tahoe's water quality by requiring all wastewater effluent to be exported out of the basin. This came about after President Nixon signed the bi-state compact which created the TRPA. Paul Laxalt was the Nevada Governor and the California Governor was Ronald Reagan at the time of ratification.

This effluent export pipeline, now 45 years old, is reaching the end of its useful life and ongoing corrosion has caused failure at multiple locations. Early phases of this project investigated the whole pipeline and prioritized the replacement schedule to maintain this critical infrastructure. The original project included replacing four miles of pipeline along State Route 28 (between Incline Village and Sand Harbor) and two miles of pipeline that crosses through Spooner State Park. Another critical component of this project was the elimination of two small wastewater treatment plants located at Sand Harbor and Memorial Point State Parks which are located next to Lake Tahoe. The wastewater is now pumped directly to IVGID for treatment at the regional plant.

Overall, IVGID has been diligently pursuing the replacement of the effluent export pipeline since 2003 in the Lake Tahoe Basin. Total capital expenditures to date have been \$20.6 million over the last 13 years to replace the aging effluent export system. IVGID has also received \$15.4 million in funding from the Federal WRDA Section 595 program through a Project Cooperation Agreement with the United State Army Corps of Engineers.

The District has now placed in its 10-year capital improvement plan an additional \$23 million in expenditures for Phase II of the Effluent Export Project to replace the remaining six miles of effluent pipeline in the Lake Tahoe Basin, between Sand Harbor and Spooner Summit. The IVGID Board of Trustees approved four consecutive years of 10% sewer rate increases, a 45% total increase to sewer rates, to accumulate the funds for this critical infrastructure replacement. These project related rate increases are now complete. The District is now collecting from our rate payers an additional \$2 million per year more than we were collecting five years ago to fund this project.

The six miles of pipeline is comprised of approximately 17,300 linear feet of welded, cement mortar lined, high pressure pipe and 13,700 linear feet of bell and spigot, cement mortar lined, low pressure steel pipe. This pipeline experienced significant leaks in 2009 and 2014. Subsequent investigations confirmed progressive corrosion of this pipeline that necessitates replacement

The District has worked with the Tahoe Transportation District (TTD) for the last three years on the feasibility of co-locating the new section of effluent export pipeline with the segment of the proposed Stateline-to-Stateline bikeway that runs from Sand Harbor to Spooner Summit. Co-location of the pipeline and the bikeway would leverage economies of scope and scale between the two projects, significantly reduce traffic and road impacts by removing the project from the State Route 28 right-of-way, and significantly enhance construction productivity and schedule by removing the work zone and schedule restrictions placed on the project by the Nevada Department of Transportation for work within SR-28. At the October 2014 Board of Trustees meeting, the District entered into an amendment of the existing Interlocal Agreement between the two agencies that would allow the completion of the next steps of the project: completion of preliminary engineering and design and conducting the necessary environmental analysis of the proposed alignment to satisfy the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the Tahoe Regional Planning Agency (TRPA) requirements.

Should TTD be able to secure funding for the final design and construction of the proposed SR-28 bikeway, District Staff estimates there will be substantial savings by co-locating the pipeline within the bikeway. Depending on the total length of pipeline eventually replaced, the District could save upwards of \$7,000,000 via co-location and cost sharing with TTD over replacing the pipeline entirely within the SR-28 roadway.

Tahoe locals have known about the superb drinking water in our communities for a long time and now the word is out. Tahoe Tap® has been receiving awards for being some of the best drinking water in the nation. IVGID won the "Best Tasting Water in Nevada" competition at the Nevada Rural Water Conference in March 2016. This honor will be taken further in January 2017 as IVGID plans to compete in the national taste test for the first time. IVGID and Glenbrook Water Cooperative are founding members of the Tahoe Water Suppliers Association (TWSA) which encourages residents and visitors to go without bottled water and instead DRINK TAHOE TAP®. IVGID and Glenbrook utilize state of the art ozone and ultraviolet disinfection to provide exceptional drinking water to their residents and both IVGID and Glenbrook hold filtration exemptions for drinking water treatment from the US EPA which is rare. There are only 60 US exemptions and TWSA members hold 6 of these attesting to the high quality and purity of Lake Tahoe's source water. Please keep in mind small systems such as IVGID and Glenbrook along with tens of thousands other small water providers must meet the same water quality standards as those systems serving millions of people in large cities. ## 2016 Watermain Replacement and Fire Flow Enhancement Project

The Incline Village General Improvement District (IVGID) currently maintains 90 miles of watermains to deliver safe and reliable potable water to all areas of Incline Village and Crystal Bay. Unfortunately, water infrastructure doesn't last forever and, as a substantial portion of the District was developed during the 1960s using corrosion and leak prone thin wall steel pipe, the District has a robust annual watermain replacement program. Since 1982, the District has replaced nearly 38 miles of steel watermains throughout Incline Village and Crystal Bay at a cost of \$17-million, not adjusted for inflation. There is approximately six miles of steel watermains (roughly seven percent of the District's total watermain inventory) still slated for replacement.

The criteria for selecting which watermains are replaced each year are threefold: replace those watermains with the most leaks that are the most challenging to repair and do so in streets with aging pavement. IVGID collaborates with the Washoe County Road Department to ensure failing watermains are replaced in advance of any County project to reconstruct, repave, or slurry the streets. We also work closely with the North Lake Tahoe Fire Protection District to determine areas where fire flows may not be optimum or additional fire hydrants may be necessary. Doing so ensures that any new watermain installed is adequately sized to meet both potable and fire flow capacity requirements. This partnership and focus of fire flow capacity allows the District's watermain replacement projects to qualify for grants from the United States Forest Service (USFS) that support fire fighting infrastructure in the Tahoe Basin. To date the District has received over \$3.5-million in grant funds from the USFS to support fire flow capacity enhancements in Incline Village and Crystal Bay.

When a new watermain is installed, the District utilizes modern materials and industry best practices to ensure the greatest possible design life of the new infrastructure. The IVGID Engineering Division performs the design, engineering, bidding, contract administration, and inspection tasks associated with the project. An outside contractor, selected via competitive public bidding, performs the installation work. This summer, the District will be replacing watermains and installing new fire hydrants on North Enterprise Street and Oriole Way in Incline Village as well as on Teresa Court and Wassou Road in Crystal Bay.

#### The 2016 project scope of work includes:

- Replacing approximately 1,100 linear feet of undersized and failing six inch steel watermain with eight inch ductile iron or C900 PVC pipe and installing one new fire hydrant on North Enterprise Street in Incline Village.
- Replacing approximately 220 linear feet of failing six inch steel watermain with new six inch ductile iron or C900 PVC pipe and installing one new fire hydrant on Oriole Way in Incline Village.
- Replacing approximately 325 linear feet of undersized and failing six inch steel watermain with eight inch ductile iron or C900 PVC pipe and installing two new fire hydrants on Teresa Court and Wassou Road in Crystal Bay.

This work will improve available fire flow capacity in these residential areas of Incline Village and Crystal Bay, will help reduce unaccounted for water loss, and will reduce service interruptions to customers and costly pavement patch penalties that result from water leak repair activities.

Construction will take place between August 1 and October 15, 2016, with normal construction hours Monday - Friday, 7 am - 6 pm, and possibly on Saturdays (if required to expedite the project). Some water shutdowns in the impacted areas will be required during construction. When possible, water outages will be planned during off-peak hours to minimize resident and business impacts. It is the District's goal to have all water shutdowns not to exceed eight hours and residents will be given 48 hour advanced notice of any water outages. IVGID resources will be available for emergency response if necessary. Specific project details and a final schedule will be determined once a construction contract has been awarded by the District's Board of Trustees.

Construction impacts to the project areas may include trench excavation and pavement restoration in the streets, driveways, and parking areas. The project is designed to limit the extents and duration of business impacts and any affected property improvements will be restored to pre-construction conditions. We ask parcel owners to please advise your guests or tenants of the upcoming project and encourage anyone to contact IVGID Engineering at 775-832-1267 with any questions or concerns. IVGID will work to ensure minimal impacts to parking access and business operations.

Some properties may experience temporary discoloration of the water or trapped air in the pipes once the new watermain is put on-line and water service is restored. This is to be expected and is standard during watermain replacements. IVGID suggests running all cold water

taps to clear affected pipes of any sediment. If any customer still experiences problems after 24 hours, please call IVGID's 24-hour hotline at 775-832-1203.






