

from our Recreation Center Manager...

Dear Residents, Members and Visitors,

Thank you for making the Incline Village Recreation Center's 2016 summer one of the busiest, exciting and memorable. This summer the Incline Village Recreation Center served an average of 400 hundred users each day. We also hosted 50 Group and Aqua Fitness classes every week, hundreds of personal training sessions, massages, swim lessons, youth and sports camps. Additionally, the Recreation Center served as the starting point for disc golfers, hikers, artists. It was and is the central hub for everything related to community recreation including general use of the facility, issuance of Recreation Picture Pass and Punch



April brought the implementation of a new recreational software system that manages all aspects of Parks and Recreation operations including Recreation Picture Pass and Punch Card issuance. This new software has just begun to unveil its potential and, with continued use and education, the plan is to expand the customer service software to include online program information, tennis court booking, activity registration, massage and personal training appointments and much more!

New equipment was added to the fitness room including two SC3 stationary bikes, a LifeFitness Elliptical Trainer, two Matrix Treadmills, one Magnum Ab/Back strength machine, and a Hammer Strength Assist Chin/Dip machine. The next additions will be new spin bikes to replace the original fleet, replacement of several strength circuit stations, and the purchase of the LifeFitness Powermill climber.

General improvements to the facility included replacement of aging carpet with easy care epoxy flooring, air conditioning repairs, water efficient shower heads, a vending machine, logo clothing, plus Adirondack chairs and market umbrellas for the deck. This Fall, these improvements will be followed by a new boiler system, front walkway improvements, gym floor resurfacing and installation of water bottle dispensers.

Residents of Incline Village and Crystal Bay and the general public are invited to drop by the Incline Village Recreation Center to tour the facility, talk to the friendly, professional fitness and recreation staff, and inquire about the many membership options to take advantage of at the most multipurpose fitness and recreation center at the lake.

Many thanks to the members and visitors for using the Incline Village Recreation Center and providing feedback, advice and continued support of the facility and staff!

TRASH COLLECTION IN INCLINE VILLAGE & CRYSTAL BAY

At the IVGID Board of Trustees on July 7, 2016 the new Solid Waste Franchise Agreement with Waste Management was approved by the Board of Trustees. The proposed services were developed by the Solid Waste Committee based on feedback received from our community. Changes to trash and recycling collection will become effective October 1, 2016. Carts will be delivered between September 12 to September 23. See the documents below for additional information on the upcoming changes.

Residential Bear Shed Service

Bear shed customers will be delivered 64 gallon recycling carts starting September 12 to September 23. To opt out of the recycling cart please contact Waste Management anytime between now and September 12 at (775)831-2971 or email inclinevillage@wm.com.

Residential Cart Service

Cart customers will be delivered 64 gallon refuse and recycling carts starting September 12 to September 23. To change your service size or to opt out of the carts please contact Waste Management anytime between now and September 12 at (775)831-2971 or email inclinevillage@wm.com.

Carts will be delivered as close to the house as possible (not at the street), but if a customer knows that they will not be home for a long period of time after the delivery dates they can request for the cart to not be delivered at the same phone or email address. They will have to call to request the delivery of the cart before they need to use trash/recycling service at the property.

If you would like to request something different than the service options above, please contact Waste Management directly to make the request and they will advise if the request can be accommodated.

- All Carts should be placed at the edge of roadway on collection day between 5 and 7AM.
- All trash and recycling will be collected weekly and must be placed inside a cart, no excess bags are allowed to be placed outside of the trash or recycling cart. The lids must close.
- Recycling can be placed in the recycling cart unbagged. No liquids or loose food can be placed in the recycling cart. Trash cannot be placed in the recycling cart. Contaminated recycling carts will be charged a service fee.
- If you have regularly have excess trash and/or recycling, you need to upsize trash/recycling service. Service size options are shown above.
- If you occasionally have excess trash you can take it to the transfer station and use one of your 4 transfer station access allotments. Alternately you can call WM for extra pick up service.
- You can drop recycling off at the transfer station anytime at no charge.
- If you need to drop-off your trash and recycling prior to your collection day you can take your weekly allotment of trash to the transfer station in-lieu of service at no additional charge.

BEAR SHED SERVICE WITH RECYCLING IN BOX



All trash must be placed inside a bear shed. Recycling may be placed inside the bear shed in a blue bag or loose in a container labeled with a sticker provided by WM.

BEAR SHED SERVICE WITH RECYCLING CART



All trash must be placed inside a bear shed. If recycling will not fit in rour bear shed, it must be placed in a WM provided recycling cart and be placed at the edge of roadway on service day for pick-up.

Commercial Cart Service (Small commercial properties with carts)

Commercial customers are required to have wildlife resistant trash service, so cart service will be upgraded to wildlife resistant containers for trash. Carts will be swapped out beginning September 12 to September 23, 2016.

Commercial Dumpster Service

(Multi-family and larger commercial properties with dumpsters)

No changes will be made to default service or pricing, but park style dumpsters are now available as a rental option from WM. If you are interested in this service please contact WM at (775)831-2971 or email inclinevillage@wm.com.

Excess Refuse and Wildlife Violations

(APPLICABLE TO RESIDENTIAL AND COMMERCIAL SERVICE) What do I do with extra refuse?

Customers can upsize their trash service, call for a one time extra pick up, or self-haul to the transfer station. Customers receive access to the transfer station for 4 loads annually, up to 3 cubic yards per load, at no additional cost. Non-contained garbage is a solid waste violation.

Where can I drop off extra recycling?

The transfer station can accept additional recycling without a fee.

What if I don't put my refuse or recycling inside my bear shed, cart, or bin?

Refuse and recycling must be contained at all times. It must be placed out for collection in an approved container. If you have a wildlife violation it will be mandatory for your service to be upgraded to wildlife resistant cart service.

Residential - Bear Shed Service

What are the advantages of installing a bear shed?

Bear sheds are convenient because you never have to take your trash to the curb on your service day. If you are not at home to take out your trash or if you do not put out your trash early enough, it will be picked up. Bear sheds are a great solution for vacation homes and full time residents alike. This service option also helps to ensure wildlife does not have access to trash which helps to avoid blight and solid waste issues in our community.

Will I automatically get a recycling cart if I have a bear shed?

Yes. Customers with a bear shed will be delivered a 64 gallon recycling cart. If you don't need the cart contact WM at 775-831-2971 or email inclinevillage@wm.com to ask for the cart to be picked up.

Why is the bear shed monthly rate cheaper?

Service rates for properties with a bear shed are cheaper to encourage this service option. Bear sheds are the ideal service option in order to reduce human bear conflicts in our mountainous environment.

Is there a rebate for installing a bear shed?

IVGID would like to help our residents in protecting our environment so we have a rebate program available for a \$150 credit towards the IVGID Public Works bill. The rebate will increase to \$300 for applications received by March 31, 2017, which are installed by June 30, 2017.

Do I need a TRPA permit for a bear shed?

No. Property owners can use our installation guideline sheet for placement information which is available on our website or by contacting our Waste Not department at 775-832-1284.

Will I be able to get the higher \$300 credit if I already received my credit for installation of a bear shed?

The higher rebate amount was not budgeted in the past for installations so we will not be able to offer the higher credit retroactively. Thank you for being proactive in installing your bear shed!

64 GALLON CART SERVICE



Service option for customers with garage or enclosed storage area. All garbage must be placed in inside the carts and lids must close. No extra bags are allowed to be outside of the carts.

WILDLIFE 64 GALLON CART SERVICE



Ideal service option for customers who store containers outdoors. All garbage must be placed in inside the carts and lids must close. No extra bags are allowed to be outside of the carts.

Residential - Cart Service

Do other communities use carts to containerize?

Wheeled rolling carts are the standard service type in the trash industry. A rental option is available for wildlife resistant carts as an extra measure to help residents avoid wildlife access to trash. Wildlife carts are the ideal service for customers who store their containers outdoors. Wildlife resistant carts will be mandatory for customers with a wildlife violation.

What are the dimensions of the carts?

Refuse and Recycling Rolling Carts 32 gallon carts are 37" H x 19" W x 24" D 64 gallon carts are 43" H x 25" W x 27" D 96 gallon carts are 45" H x 29" W x 34" D Wildlife Resistant Rolling Carts 64 gallon carts are 42" H x 26" W x 26" D 96 gallon carts are 46" H x 28" W x 31" D

When will carts be delivered? When can I start using my cart?

Delivery of carts will be delivered between September 12 to September 23. Carts can be used once they are delivered to the property. Weekly recycling will begin on October 1, 2016. Billing for the new refuse rates will start October 1, 2016.

What if I want different size cart or a wildlife resistant cart?

Based on our average customer, 64 gallon carts are the default service for refuse and recycling. If you need to change your cart size you are able to do so immediately by contacting Waste Management at 775-831-2971 or emailing inclinevillage@wm.com. After January 1, 2017 you may elect to decrease your refuse cart size or change service to a wildlife resistant cart. The swap out fee will be waived for the initial rightsizing of service done prior to April 1, 2017. After this date a swap out fee of \$50.00 will be assessed.

How will I get my cart(s) to the curb?

The carts have wheels so it will be easier to get to them to the curb. Customers can also upgrade to side yard service where the collector will pick up the trash up to 50 feet from the edge of pavement. Qualified disabled customers can make an arrangement for side yard service for no additional charge with the trash collector. For more information please contact Waste Management at 775-831-2971.

I do not have an area to store the cart, what will I do?

You can install a bear shed or utilize the wildlife resistant cart rental option since the wildlife resistant cart can be stored outside.

The carts are plastic; won't they break?

Carts provided by the collector will include maintenance and repairs to carts which get damaged.

I will not be home on my trash day. Can I drop my trash off at the transfer station?

Yes, trash can be dropped off at the transfer station but there will still be a monthly service fee. Your weekly allotment of trash can be dropped off at no charge (in lieu of service), but if the amount dropped off exceeds this volume then standard transfer station fees will be applicable or the customer can use one of their four transfer station access allowances. As an alternative, property owners can also install a bear box and trash will be collected from the box on their trash day.

Will I be able to buy my own cart?

No, this will not be an option based on the standardization needed for the collector's equipment. Existing wildlife resistant carts are exempt from this requirement and can continue to be used by customers.

What will I do with my old 32 gallon can(s)?

Cans will not be collected since customers purchased their cans and they may want to repurpose them for another use. If customers do not wish to keep their old can(s) they can drop them off at the Transfer Station for recycling at no charge until December 30, 2016.

I do not have a way to use the transfer station access allowances.

Not everyone will utilize the transfer station access allowances but this will help many homeowners who need a larger volume clean-up day option or have extra yard waste.

TRASH COLLECTION IN INCLINE VILLAGE & CRYSTAL BAY

Residential - Recycling Cart Service

Do I have to have a recycling cart?

Single-stream recycling into blue bags will no longer be an option. All customers will continue to be billed for recycling, regardless of whether they will use their single-stream recycling cart or not. Participation in recycling is not mandatory, however 75-90% of customers in Reno and Las Vegas participated with the implementation of a single-stream recycling cart program.

Can I get a larger recycling cart or an additional recycling cart?

Yes, recycling carts are available in 32, 64 or 96 gallon sizes. Customers can also add additional recycling carts to their service.

Why isn't the recycling cart bear resistant?

Single-stream recycling MUST be clean so it does not contaminate other recyclables therefore recycling is not an attractant to wildlife. If it is not clean, it is not recyclable.

Don't they just throw the recycling away?

No, recycling is taken to Reno for processing with the single stream recycling collected in Reno and Sparks.

Residential - Uard Waste Recycling (FOR BEAR SHED & CART SERVICE)

I will have less refuse volume allotment, now what do I do with my pine needles?

The program is now a 16 week curbside yard waste program with a larger allotment of 96 stickers. Every property will also receive annual transfer station access allowances for 4 loads, up to 3 cubic yards per load, which a homeowner can choose to use for yard waste.



THE OLD WAY - INEFFICIENT

Two - 32 gallon trash cans and two - 32 gallon recycling blue bags in a single car garage.



One - 64 gallon wheeled trash cart & one - 64 gallon wheeled recycling cart take up less space than the same volume the old way.

Previously if you used all 72 yard waste stickers and placed out 5 extra bags of pine needles every week for the 5 months of April-August you would have disposed of 182 bags. With the new Franchise if you use all 96 yard waste stickers and your 4 loads at the transfer station for yard waste you will be able to dispose of 180 bags.

The recommendation from TRPA for best management practices (BMP's) is to not remove pine needles in the fall. This helps with erosion control during winter months.

I am a second homeowner; why do I pay for weekly refuse service when I don't use it?

This is a Washoe County and IVGID requirement to prevent illegal dumping. The minimum service size can be selected for customers who do not generate much trash.


Residential - Billing And Website

When will I receive my first statement from Waste Management?

The first statement to be issued direct from WM will be sent on October 1, 2016. Statements will be issued quarterly for 3 months of charges. Charges will be billed in advance, so the first billing period will cover October 2016 thru December 2016.

Why is billing for refuse services switching to WM instead of IVGID?

This switch will create more transparency about your refuse collection and rates. It will also allow customers to get more information about their account from WM's online portal. Customers are currently unable to use this functionality since they do not receive a bill from WM.



Yes, customers will be able to setup auto payment and email statements with WM.

Will Waste Management have trash and recycling information on their website?

Yes, WM will have information about trash and recycling collection available on their website. Customers can also create an online account to get information about their specific account.

When will the new website be available?

The new Waste Management website www.inclinevillage.wm.com will be live by September 12, 2016.

Commercial Service

What do I do if I have human error or wildlife issues with the default service of a wildlife resistant bin or cart?

Customers can rent a park style bin, which lock automatically when the door is closed, by contacting Waste Management at 775-831-2971. A bear shed can be installed or built to prohibit wildlife access to dumpsters.

Is there a rebate for installing a bear shed?

IVGID would like to help our businesses in protecting the environment so we have a rebate program available for a \$150 credit towards the IVGID Public Works bill. The rebate will increase to \$300 for applications received by March 31, 2017, which are installed by June 30, 2017.

Will I be able to buy a park style dumpster?

No, this will not be an option based on the standardization needed for the collector's equipment.

How do I address illegal dumping?

The Nevada Revised Statute NRS 444.630 prohibits illegal dumping.

Commercial Service - Recycling

Will there be changes to recycling service options? All of the commercial recycling service options will still be available.

Commercial Service - Uard Waste

What should commercial customers do with yard waste?

Customers can use their dumpsters, self-haul to the transfer station or rent a yard waste bin from a private hauler.

Franchise Agreement

Why is the contract extension so long?

The contract extension for an additional 10 years is needed to spread out the costs of the infrastructure requirements for these updates. If we choose a shorter contract the refuse rates would be higher to cover these costs. The minimum Franchise is typically 10 years, but this varies by area. Some examples in our area include:

Why don't we buy the transfer station so we have more control over our trash rates?

We have no funds collected and this would create additional liabilities as well as risks on the investment

Introducing Your New Trash, Recycling and Yard Waste Service

On July 7, 2016 the IVGID Board of Trustees approved a new collection franchise agreement with Waste Management based on feedback from the community. Effective October 1, 2016, new program features include:



Weekly Single Stream Recycling Collection

- WM will deliver a 64-gallon wheeled recycling cart to every home, beginning September 12, 2016.
- Collection will occur on your regular trash day, starting October 1.

WM Provided Trash Carts

- A 64-gallon wheeled trash cart will be delivered to customers without existing wildlife resistant carts or bear sheds, beginning September 12, 2016.
 - Old personal trash cans may be recycled at the Incline Village Transfer Station for free through December 31, 2016.
- Wildlife resistant carts and service is available through WM. Please contact Customer Service for pricing and availability. (Customers do not have to replace their existing wildlife resistant carts.)



YARD WASTE STICKER

25 through July 18, 2016 place sticker or elics garbage bag (max. weight = 40 lbs.)

Bulky Item Collection

 Customers may drop off up to three (3) cubic yards of trash four (4) times per year at the Incline Village Transfer Station free of charge.

Extended Yard Waste Recycling

- · Curbside yard waste collection extended from 12 to 16 weeks.
- The number of stickers for bagged materials increased from 72 to 96, good for collection of bagged yard debris up to 40 pounds each. Stickers will be mailed via first class mail to the billing address on record.

Quarterly Residential Billing via Waste Management

- First billing statement will be sent by October 1, 2016. It will cover the billing period October through December 2016.
- · Charges are billed in advance.

Can I use carts other than those provided by Waste Management?

No. The Incline Village residential franchise agreement requires the use of Waste Management carts. Waste Management carts allow for a more expedient collection allowing us to serve you better. (Existing wildlife resistant carts are exempt from this requirement and can continued to be used by customers.)

How often is recycling collected?

Under the new agreement, recycling will be picked up weekly on the same day your trash is collected.

Do I need to rinse out my recyclables before putting them in my recycling cart?

Liquids and loose food cannot be placed in the recycling cart. Food and liquids spoil the recyclability of paper and cardboard. Removing food from containers also reduces the risk of wildlife scavenging.

What will happen if I put trash in my recycling cart?

The effectiveness of the program is a community effort. Just one resident can contaminate an entire load of recyclables. Therefore, if you put trash in your recycling cart, you may be billed for additional trash collection. You may also lose your option to participate in the recycling program.

What if I have extra waste that won't fit into my trash cart?

In addition to curbside collection, customers are entitled to take one load of trash (up to 3 cubic yards per load) to the Incline Transfer Station four (4) times per year at no additional charge. Customers cannot place extra bags of trash at the curb. (See reverse side for rules about bagged green waste)

What if I want an additional cart or different size?

If you find the delivered 64-gallon cart does not meet your needs, please contact customer service at (775) 831-2971 for additional sizes and rates.

What should I do if a cart is stolen or damaged?

Contact customer service at (775) 831-2971 to replace or repair the cart.

My trash/recycling pick up was missed, who do I contact? Please contact customer service at (775) 831-2971.

Where can I place materials not listed on the right?

Household hazardous waste, e-waste, pharmaceuticals and needles cannot not be placed in trash or recycling carts. They must be handled separately. Please visit www.yourtahoeplace.com/ public-works/waste-not for more information.







ay back in 1966, while the community of Incline Village was still in its defining stages, Oklahoma native Art Wood envisioned a four-season resort community – a "Pebble Beach of the Sierra" as many have said – and hired Austrian ski consultant Luggi Foeger to design and build

Ski Incline (as it was then called) as one of the pillars of that vision.

After only four months of construction, Ski Incline opened its lifts in November of 1966 with a skier-friendly layout on the lower mountain of the resort. In 1987, ski resort manager Jurgen Wetzstein led the development of the upper mountain with the addition of the Crystal Quad to the top of the peak – an expansion that doubled the resort's skiable acreage and added more advanced terrain. The addition also spurred the name change to Diamond Peak.

During the upcoming 2016-17 winter season, Diamond Peak will celebrate its golden anniversary – 50 years of skiing and snowboarding in the most beautiful setting on earth – and we are inviting the entire community of Incline Village as well as our extended Diamond Peak family around the world to help us commemorate this milestone.

FACILITY ENHANCEMENTS AT THE IVGID BEACHES

n February 24, 2016, the Incline Village General Improvement District's Board of Trustees approved, via unanimous vote, the IVGID Beaches Recreation Enhancement Opportunities Plan. The approval of this document, which can be viewed at www. ivgidbeachstudy.com, was the culmination

of two years of work to develop comprehensive recommendations to guide future capital investment made by the District at Burnt Cedar, Incline, Ski, and Hermit Beaches. The development of the Enhancement Plan included two publically held meetings (one to discuss site analysis findings and one to discuss survey results and site improvement opportunities), dozens of hours of operations and site use observations, numerous interviews with operations staff and concessionaires, and extensive surveying that included an intercept survey of beach users (with 267 responses) and a mailed and on-line community survey (with 2,149 responses).

Based on this comprehensive effort, the Enhancement Plan identifies numerous potential improvements to the facilities at the Beaches and their estimated costs. These include:

- Improvement of entries and pedestrian access at all Beach properties to expedite the check-in process and enhance pedestrian safety.
- Replacement of the restroom/concession building at Incline Beach to create a beachfront hospitality zone.
- Replacement of the restroom building at Burnt Cedar Beach to improve use, increase the number of available fixtures, and replace aging infrastructure.
- Enhancement of the Burnt Cedar Pool House for improved concession operations.
- Enhancement of the Burnt Cedar Pool mechanical equipment for improved and more reliable operations.
- Enhancement of the group and individual picnic/BBQ areas at all Beach properties with additional focus on the individual sites on the western side of Burnt Cedar Beach to improve customer experience and enhance use.

- Enhancement of beachfront access and pedestrian connectivity at all Beach properties with additional focus on connectivity between the western site amenities and the eastern beachfront areas at Burnt Cedar Beach to improve customer experience and enhance use.
- Provision of non-motorized watercraft storage and a formal launching area on the western side of Burnt Cedar Beach, similar to operations at Hermit Beach, to reduce the waiting list presently in place for storage at Hermit Beach.
- Development of a consistent design aesthetic for all architectural and site finishes across all Beach properties including buildings, shelters, signage (including fonts and colors), landscape/retaining walls, curbs, and walkways.

The recommendations in the Enhancement Plan are simply recommendations and the purpose of the document is to guide the major capital improvements that could be completed at the Beach Properties over the next 10 to 15 years. Ultimately, the projects selected for implementation and the pace at which those projects are completed must be decided by the District's Board of Trustees based on input from the residents of Incline Village.

Of the improvements identified in the Enhancement Plan, the project overwhelmingly identified by the community surveys as the top priority is the replacement of the restroom/concession building at Incline Beach. Funds to complete design of this work were included in the District's FY 2015/2016 and FY 2016/2017 budgets.

A comprehensive Request for Qualifications process to select a design team was completed this spring and a design services contract was awarded to Bull Stockwell Allen by the Board of Trustees on May 18. 2016. The goal of the project is to replace the over capacity and aging 1970s structure with a robust and modern facility that meets the capacity needs of today's operations at Incline Beach and the expectations of Incline Village residents. A new facility will enhance food and beverage operations and customer service by incorporating current industry best practices for food and beverage concessions and commercial kitchen design. Additionally, a new facility will enhance the quality, size, and number of restrooms available at Incline Beach and will also provide restrooms capable of use during the winter to allow the elimination of the temporary portable toilets during the cold weather months. Finally, a new facility will enhance the customer experience at Incline Beach by including formalized outdoor seating areas, outdoor showers, and improved customer flow from the drop-off area and parking lots to the beachfront.

Preliminary design work is underway and a public workshop was held on August 18, 2016 to discuss and receive feedback on design elements and site opportunities. The design work will continue through the fall and winter of 2016 with additional community outreach, information sessions, and opportunities for public comment and feedback planned. A construction schedule for the new facility will be dictated by the scope of work developed during design as well as future budget approvals by the Board of Trustees but would begin no sooner than the fall of 2017.







This Summer, we began the kick off of a yearlong process of master planning for the future of IVGID Community Services and we need to hear what the community wants for its' facilities and programs. The last effort was in 2000 when the Incline Village Recreational Facilities Master Plan was completed. Together, we will develop a long-range community services master plan to identify and plan for the future of community driven recreation activities and facilities in Incline Village and Crystal Bay. To date, the District has undertaken significant effort to assess many of the existing recreation facilities and operations and has developed planning documents, by venue, that identify the capital maintenance needs as well as the operational enhancement and future infrastructure investment opportunities. However, no major effort has been undertaken to assess the community priorities for future infrastructure investment in the existing venues or evaluate what services/facilities not presently provided by the District that are desired by the community.

Throughout this project we will conduct public meetings and community surveys to assess expectations, help set priorities, evaluate the opportunities for additional/ expanded recreational offerings and facilities, and if identified, assess the community's willingness to fund new or different facilities and services. We hope you will join us for upcoming Community Workshops and participate in the conversation about current and future IVGID Community Services.


