Reservations:

- Every person must have a reservation to be admitted to the event. Every attendee must also bring with them proof of residency (IVGID picture pass, ID with IV/CB address, lease, or utility bill). Failure to have a reservation or present proof of residency will result in being turned away.
- If you have a reservation and you are no longer planning on attending – or if you have multiple reservations, please call 775.832.1310 or email parksandrec@ivgid.org so we can release those slots to community members on the waitlist
- All minors must be accompanied by an adult. Group size is limited to 6 people from the same household.

Parking:

Parking is available at the Incline Village Recreation Center, the Tennis Center, the Reynold's Building, and Incline Middle School. Please do not walk on Incline Way. Use paths that lead to CERT safe road crossing. The crossing will be located parallel to the back-drive of the Recreation Center which will be closed to cars. Aspen Grove lot is available for ADA parking ONLY. Overflow lot will be closed.

Liability Waiver:

At check-in you will be asked to sign to acknowledge that you received the waiver and agree to its terms. You must sign in order to participate in the event.

Packing List

- A Face covering: Costume masks are NOT a substitute for face coverings and masks. Masks should be made from two or more breathable fabric layers that cover the nose and mouth.
- Proof of residency: You must bring proof of residency for EVERY member of your party to be admitted (IVGID picture pass, ID with IV/CB address, lease, utility bill)
- A flashlight if you are in an evening slot (5pm-)
- A candy bag!
