Camp Leadership



Peter Salazar is one of the greats of the Incline High School soccer program, and he has continued to improve his skills and knowledge of the game since his graduation in 2010. From the age of six onward, whether playing pick-up in the neighborhood or representing the Incline Invasion, at the time one of the premier club teams of the Reno-Tahoe area, Peter has brought excellence and leadership to the field. He has always served as team captain: in club soccer, on his high school team, and in the elite men's league in which he currently participates.

Peter lists his career highlight as winning the state championship with the Incline Highlanders his senior year, when the team went 29-1 on the season. Peter captained the team, received first team all-state and first team all-league honors, and was named team co-MVP. Peter currently plays for Playa Azul in the Reno Premier division, along with Reno FC, an all-star team that represents the area in tournaments throughout the West. He works for the Incline Village General Improvement District, where he brings his experience coaching in soccer camps and working with kids to bear on his favorite aspect of the job: helping children as both a role model and instructor.



Michael Ceragioli played four years of NCAA soccer for the Pomona-Pitzer Sagehens while attending Pomona College in southern California. He spent his final three years as a starter, as both an outside midfielder and an outside back, where he used his blazing speed and tactical intelligence to help the team to a league championship his junior season. He has continued his relationship with soccer through coaching a team of elementary-school aged kids for the AMERICA SCORES program in the San Francisco Bay Area, and he plays competitively in San Francisco. He has worked with children since graduating from college and hopes to continue to blend his passion for helping kids and passion for soccer in his work.

Michael also grew up in Incline Village. He is a long-time teammate of Peter's, on the Incline Invasion club team and on the championship Incline High School team. Michael shared captain's honors with Peter throughout their careers, as well as team MVP during their state championship season. Their chemistry always made them a formidable pair on the field, and re-channeled into coaching in the present, makes them a strong and nuanced team in instruction.



Allie Tao claims that she is even better at soccer than Peter and Michael, although they are not so sure. She certainly has the resume to back her up: growing up in the San Francisco Bay Area, Allie was a member of the nationally number one ranked Mustang Soccer girls 1992 team; and in her career as forward at Pomona-Pitzer, she stands as one of the most accomplished female players in PP history: she scored over 30 goals in her four years, captained the team, earned all-league honors three times, all-region honors twice, and was named conference MVP her senior season.

Allie is a fierce competitor in any setting. (If you are looking to take it easy at the camp, you are much better off playing on Peter or Michael's team.) She currently coaches for the SF SOL FC soccer club, part of the female leadership non-profit Girls Leading Girls, which uses soccer as an instrument for the development of positive personal values.
