

Tahoe's Watershed Dynamics

Snow, snow, snow! What will happen to all these lovely flakes? They will make their way from their landing spot to Lake Tahoe. Incline Village and Crystal Bay includes five watersheds, identified by their streams; Tunnel Creek, Mill Creek, Incline Creek, Third Creek, Wood Creek, Burnt Cedar Creek, Second Creek, and First Creek. The creek systems through Incline Village and Crystal Bay are an important part of our watershed and a key part of our water cycle. Precipitation, our favorite is snow, falls into the community, snowmelt moving as surface water runoff enters a Stream Environment Zones (SEZ). The water then travels through the creek to Lake Tahoe, where it is used as our source of drinking water. Evaporation is the final step in the water cycle and Lake Tahoe average annual evaporation rate is 0.1 inch a day. The stormwater system here in Incline Village and Crystal bay is open. This means that water that flows in our streets and landscapes is not collected via pipes and brought to the Wastewater Treatment Plant. Stormwater and seasonal runoff travel in an open or natural system to the tributary creeks throughout the community directly to Lake Tahoe. Our watershed also includes groundwater. Many neighborhood creeks run throughout the year and during drought conditions. This is because there are groundwater seeps and springs. These waters can be seen running through the SEZ which can include moving on streets, into stormwater inlets that move water under roads to outfalls that bring the water into a creek. Join us on Saturday

May 20, 2023 to monitor the water quality of seasonal runoff as part of the 23rd Annual Tahoe Truckee Snapshot Day. Volunteer teams are needed for all five creeks within our watershed. More information and
