

## WATER EFFICIENCY RESIDENTIAL REBATES

IVGID Public Works is offering water efficiency rebates to Incline Village and Crystal Bay customers for the installation of a high-efficiency toilet or washing machine.

Appliances must meet EPA WaterSense and/or Energy Star certification and use the approved amount of water per device.

Rebate amount maximum of \$100, with a limit of one rebate per parcel, annually. The number of rebates issued in the community is limited to 100 per fiscal year.



Eligible appliances include:

### **HIGH EFFICIENCY TOILET**

Must be WaterSense rated and use 1.28 gallons of water per flush.



#### **HIGH EFFICIENCY WASHER**

Must be Energy Star rated and have a water factor of 3.7 or less.

### **High-Efficiency WaterSense Toilet**

**High-Efficiency Toilets**: Recent advancement have allowed toilets to use 1.28 gallons per flush or less while still providing equal or superior performance. Replacing older toilets with WaterSense models, the average family can reduce water used for toilets by 20-60%.

- Verification: Resident must send proof of payment dated after July 1,
   2019, plus photos of model number and installed toilet.
- Product must be listed on the EPA WaterSense website.

## **High-Efficiency Residential Clothes Washer**



Energy Star Rated	Must have water factor of 3.7 or less *

**High-Efficiency Washers:** utilize technological advances to deliver excellent wash performance while saving both water and energy. Resource efficient models use 35-50% less water and approximately 50% less energy. The water efficiency of clothes washers is rated using the term "water factor" to describe and compare its water use.

- Fill out application and submit to IVGID Waste Not
- Washers must have a water factor of 3.7 or less to qualify.
- Verification: Resident must send proof of payment dated after July 1, 2019, plus photos of model number and installed washer.
- Product must be listed on the EPA Energy Star website.
- \* Water factor is measured by the quantity of water (gallons) used to wash each cubic foot of laundry. A lower water factor represents greater water and energy efficiency.
