In September 2025, the IVGID Board of Trustees authorized the General Manager to enter into an agreement with Incline Ice Foundation to accept a donation of an ice rink package to support future ice rink activities in Incline Village.

Within a few months, IVGID took ownership/delivery of the ice rink package, including a portable ice rink measuring 82 feet by 50 feet, clear plexiglass walls and doors, an electric ice resurfacer, 250 pairs of ice skates, rolling skate racks, skate lace area mats to cover 1,500 square feet, 25 skating aids, a skate sharpener, and other miscellaneous equipment that supports skating.

In order to bring winter ice skating online in Incline Village, several capital expenditures need to be completed, with early estimates totaling approximately \$790,000, including:

1. Purchase of chiller to maintain the frozen surface
2. Upgrades to electrical transformer and distribution equipment
3. Site work at the Championship Course driving range

Given the competing demands for capital funding this fiscal year and the District's other long-term capital priorities, including the long-awaited upgrades to Diamond Peak Ski Area, the IVGID Board of Trustees deferred a decision on funding capital improvements for the ice rink until the Fiscal Year 2027/28 budget discussions next spring. In the interim, IVGID is seeking community support to help fund the necessary capital expenditures to continue winter ice rink activities in Incline Village.
